

2023 Summer Bridge Program Student Survey Outcomes

In the summer of 2023, 298 students from historically marginalized schools and community-based organizations in Trenton, Newark, and Ewing, New Jersey participated in the Princeton-Blairstown Center's (PBC) Summer Bridge Program. For the eighth year in a row, PBC offered academic enrichment and leadership development programs designed to lessen summer learning loss; build critical 21st Century social emotional learning (SEL) skills such as communication, cooperation, teamwork, problem solving, and healthy risk-taking; and help students form positive, supportive relationships with peers and adults. Each of these intended outcomes is grounded in peer-reviewed research that demonstrates the importance of these short-term outcomes for long-term outcomes, such as success in school, employment, and other arenas. Each group participated in this intensive, educational experience of 5-days/4-nights during a separate week at the 268-acre Blairstown Campus near the Delaware Water Gap.

PBC measured outcomes using 1) the work products/fruits of the academic components; 2) feedback from leaders and teacher/staff chaperones connected with the partner schools/organizations; and 3) a research-based assessment developed with the American Camp Association (ACA) as part of a National Research Study conducted by Philliber Research Associates that gauges students' self-perceptions/attitudes and changes in these.

The student surveys showed positive results, particularly given that most students are continuing to suffer from academic and developmental deficits that are a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Students were asked to answer a series of questions around demographic information as well as questions around SEL skills including teamwork, problem solving (perceived competence), responsibility, and affinity for nature.

Overall, it is clear that after their experience at the Summer Bridge Program, 72-87% of the students felt their SEL skills or appreciation of/comfort in the natural world increased.

Other significant findings that resulted from this 5-day session at Blairstown:

- 63% of the students rated their time with PBC Blairstown as an "8, 9 or 10" for the "best time ever."
- 72% of the students felt more confident they could be a good leader.
- 79% of the students felt they could be more effective in helping a group be successful.
- 79% of the students felt more tolerant toward others with opinions different from their own.
- 75% of the students felt better able to cooperate with others.
- 76% enjoy the freedom of the outdoors.

Two hundred and sixty-two (88%) students completed the student surveys, which were administered electronically on Kindle Fire tablets via Survey Monkey.

For each of the following statements, e.g., "I can be a good group leader," the first part of each question asks the student to respond how true this statement is for him or her now (i.e., at the end of the program). Then the second part asks, "Is the statement more or less true today than before attending Blairstown?" This gauges how the student perceives the effects of the Summer Bridge experience.

TEAMWORK
